



Secretary's Report Santa Barbara Sail and Power Squadron Business Meeting January 4, 2018

Commander's Report

Cdr. Susan Hodges, called the meeting to order at 1935. Quorum established. P/C Wil Swalling in hospital – Secretary Ron will send flowers.

Signal Hoist - Doris Swalling will be unable to do the Signal Hoist. For the interim, P/C Rich Ciolino will take on the publication - need to advertise next month's COW. This may be the time to move the newsletter to Mail Chimp, a template for e-newsletters, utilizing our web-site (under 300 addresses free)

The upcoming monthly District Meeting will use the Go-To-Meeting program. P/C Don Crowder will join in on the remote meeting.

Education Officer's Report - P/C Richard Ciolino

ABC Class concluded with 16 passing the test, making a total of 26 for the year. Rich sent emails to students to tell them how to get their CA Boater Card. Graduate must go on-line to the CA web-site, send \$10 along with a PDF of their ABC certificate of completion.

Suggestion was made to offer a refresher seminar and conduct test for current members of the Squadron in order to obtain their CA Boater Card.

Finished up year with 2 seminars, Celestial Navigation Primer and Forecasting Weather Basics. Both seminars were very successful with 18 students at the Weather class. SEO Rich is developing a class schedule and education budget for 2018. Will sit down with instructors and come up with a firm plan for the year. Most likely all instructors need to be re-certified this year.

Vessel Safety Check - P/C John Profant

Two vessel safety checks were conducted recently. John has now attained the qualification threshold.

Administrative Officer's Report – Lt/C Betty Koch

Lt/C Virginia Johns – report on November's Maritime Museum event. Had 60 attendees. This year expanded evening with story telling. Everyone had a great time. Maritime Museum is very accommodating to us.

P/C Don Crowder - Nominating Committee


Don reminded Nominating Committee that the nomination list needs to be published to all members 30 days prior to the COW.
