


Before that I'd like to thank our teaching staff for a great job last year in providing professional, lively, entertaining, and educational treatment of topics from basic boating to engine maintenance and electrical systems - thanks to Steve Young (Marine Electrical Systems), Steve York (Partner in Command Seminar), John **Profant (Piloting), Pete Seagoe (Engine Maintenance and ABC Course), Steve** Hodges (Celestial Nav basics and Weather Seminars in 2017), Mike Pyzel (Local Weather Conditions in 2017), and the rest of our ABC Course team, Neil Ablitt, **Tom Koch, Dennis Johns, and Ron Slocum.** It's encouraging to hear students' compliments about our instructors because what distinguishes us from other sources of boating education, such as on-line classes and searching through the vast on-line collection of nautical information, is being led by experienced boaters with a talent for providing topical boating course information along with personal experiences. The tagline for our newly named "America's Boating Club" is very fitting to our educational philosophy - "for boaters, by boaters" - and it's key to our success as we go forward in this on-line era.

Educational Programs Summary: The past two years have been very successful in fulfilling our mission of educating the boating public and the table below provides a summary of education class data for 2017 and 2018.

Some basic factoids about our courses are:

- 1. The ABC course is open to members and non-members. It is a good source for attracting new members. This course runs for five weeks including a final exam, but could be extended to seven if the Basic Navigation portion of the text is given. The test also qualifies for the California Boater Card.
- 2. The seminars are given in one roughly two-hour session and are open to members and non-members, and there is no exam. Students can get a certificate of completion.
- 3. The advanced grade courses (e.g. Piloting, Advanced Piloting, Seamanship, Electrical Systems, and Engine Maintenance) are given to members only and run about 10 weeks. Non-members can join when they sign up for one of these courses.

From left to right, the table above shows: when the class was given; how many students signed up; how many took the final exam; how many passed the final exam; how many were non-members; and how many joined as new members to take the class or, in the case of some ABC classes, how many joined because they were interested in taking advantage of membership in the future.

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We brought in 50 new members from our ABC and Advanced Grade offerings over the past two years.

We had one member request the Seamanship course which was completed in 2017.

Of the 189 total class attendees (seats taken), 80 attended only one class and 109 seats were taken by 40 individuals that attended multiple classes (that is 2-6 different classes). So, adding the 80 that took only one class to the 40 that took multiple classes gives 120 individuals, members and non-members, that took our classes in the last two years.

ABC Class Data: USPS National puts out ABC Course data on all squadrons throughout the country. Here are some statistics for the active squadrons in District 13 from July 2017 to January 2019:

Santa Barbara ranked third within D13 for ABC students and 71st out of all 250 active (providing education classes) USPS squadrons. Our average class size is about 12 for the three classes given. To date, 904 students have taken the ABC class throughout the United States.

Plans for 2019: The near-term plan for our class offerings is to offer another ABC class in February and then offer the new and revised Seamanship course, called Boat Handling, immediately after the ABC class. We will see if the low turnout of five in our last ABC offering (October to December 2018) was an anomaly or is it indicating a new normal, perhaps as boaters head to on-line sources or the California State course to qualify for their California Boater Card. The class will start on February 19.

The new Boat Handling course is an updated version of the old Seamanship course that covers anchoring, marlinspike, rules of the road, docking and undocking, emergencies on board, and handling your boat underway. Boat Handling is a good follow-on to the ABC class since some of the same topics covered in the ABC class are given much more attention and detail. Boat Handling is set up as a six-week class of six essentially independent seminars. A final exam will be available.

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Boat Handling is also unique as it is the first of newly named courses - all advanced courses will have new names this year that are more descriptive, have updates, and adapt to a seminar format. Additionally, Boat Handling and the other advanced courses are adopting an eBook format and phasing out hard textbooks. Each student will be given an electronic password key to download a .PDF format textbook. Instructor material will be similarly downloaded – no more CDs. The new course was piloted last fall by several squadrons and will be discussed at next month's National Meeting. There might be some changes made to the pilot material but it should be ready for general use early this year – our planned start date is March 26.

As we get these two classes underway I'll be reviewing the results of the Education Program reports from National, talking with our staff and working to plan the rest of the year's offerings.

Treasurer's Message Lt/C Steve York, P

The SBSPS Finance Committee prepared a draft budget for 2019 that was reviewed by the Bridge and approved at the January meeting. Key highlights for 2019 are:

- Dues will be adjusted to stay in synch with National currently \$77 for single members and \$124.50 for families.
- We will be subsidizing a smaller portion of the cost for the Holiday dinner compared to last year
- The COW and PCYC social events will break even
- We will continue to hold a student and member appreciation event at the Maritime Museum in the Fall
- Ships Store is planned to break even
- Signal Hoist and Roster will be delivered electronically saving postage and printing

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








































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Ratchet up your deep-sea fishing skills with a class from SBCC



Captain David Bacon of WaveWalker Charters is teaching classes about fishing for SBCC's Extended Learning program. So, ratchet up your fish-catching skills and learn more about fish. The first of a series of classes begins on the evening of Monday, March 4th and runs each week until April 29th. The class title is "Experience Deep Sea Fishing" and teaches boat-based fishing.

Capt. Bacon is an expert fisherman with a lifetime of fishing and nearly thirty years of experience as captain of a charter fishing boat for demanding clientele. The Captain also owns Hook, Line & Sinker fishing center at 4010 Calle Real in Santa Barbara. He will teach you about various fish and techniques, rods/reels/tackle and accessories, inshore fishing, deepwater structure fishing, offshore fishing for pelagic fish, knot tying, various fishing lines, lure or bait selection and how to rig up for success.

Here is how to sign up for this fee-based class:

Go to https://sbcc.augusoft.net/ and click on "Click to Register". Registering will give you a student ID number. Keep that number because it will allow you to register for the class.

After registering, find the Search box and enter **22549** which is the class ID. The search takes you to a page where you can sign up. If you are already registered in the system, just login and search for the class ID, 22549.
