

I go to Fry's every May to find out what I've forgotten to bring so I'll be better prepared for the rest of the summer.

Steve Carlson and Boris Alves joined me on the pleasant trip. We left the Harbor at 8am Friday, motoring over. About 8 foot swell's made it interesting, and the sun came out ½ way to the island. One boat from Ventura Harbor was anchored when we arrived and another showed up before dusk.



Normally it takes about a week to get ready for the first trip and only two minor issues: I forgot to recharge the batteries in my handheld Garmin, but handled when we anchored. The other one could have been a lot worse. The knot tying the dinghy rope came undone while we were inside the boat late Saturday afternoon. Another boater had just anchored, noticed it drifting and brought it back, so "Minor Issue". I'll check knots more frequently and learn the eye splice.

Sunday started with me watching the Sun rise over the coastal fog bank, We left the anchorage about 8am, and ½ hour later had the motor off and sailed till the middle of the channel, then motor sailed the rest of the way.

## Libertad to Baja Naval

Scott Burns, Boris Alves (a friend), Virginia, and I left SB harbor at 9pm Thursday night, May 26. We arrived Avalon, Catalina Island around noon Friday. The main harbor was full so we had to grab a mooring named Dumb Luck in Descanso Bay. We called the shoreboat for a ride into Avalon for dinner, saltwater taffy, and a frozen banana. Any sleep deprivation experienced on the first leg of the journey was corrected with a good night's sleep at Catalina. We left Avalon at first light (6am) and arrived San Diego Saturday, about 5pm after a few hours of spinnaker sailing. After picking up some diesel, we tucked into our slip at the police quest dock on the end of Shelter Island. A short walk to the restaurant at Kona Kai Hotel resulted in a very nice dinner with a view of the marina. Another good night's sleep and we were up at 6:30am for the last leg to Ensenada. Arriving Ensenada Sunday evening we were greeted with loud music and thousands of people walking the waterfront promenade and the downtown streets. The early evening was spent prepping the boat for the haul out the next morning and then we all left for a beer at Hussong's and dinner. Hussong's was too crowded and crazy for us to even reach the bar to order a beer so we scratched that idea and headed to dinner. We stopped at a restaurant grilling chicken over an open fire in the window. We had four different Mexican dishes that were shared among everyone and a pitcher of Margaritas that we had no trouble finishing off. Stumbling back to the boat we easily fell asleep even though the music continued late into the evening. Monday morning we were processed through immigration and customs and the boat was hauled but it took so long that we were worried that taking a bus back to Tijuana would not arrive soon enough for us to catch our train to SB. The boatyard procured a driver to take us to TJ. When we got to TJ we were shocked by the havoc that gripped the city. Police were routing traffic in circles and we spent the next 1-1/2 hours wandering around TJ trying to get close to the border. Eventually we could see the border and we stopped the driver, bailed out of the car and made a run for the unbelievably long line to walk across the border (the end of Memorial Day weekend). By the time we finally entered California, we only had 20 minutes to make the train. We

grabbed a taxi and he got us to the train station just moments before it was scheduled to leave. Boris was trying to pay the confrontational taxi driver while Scott ran for the train and stood in the doorway to prevent the train from leaving while the rest of us tried to catch up. The conductor did not have any sympathy for the desperation of our situation and nearly arrested Scott but instead just kicked him off. At this point we were all exhausted and it was decided that a rented car was the preferred way to get back to SB rather than the last train from San Diego (which wouldn't arrive until after midnight). In conclusion, it was a grand adventure that none of us ever want to do again.



Retrieving traps and tires; metal crates, poles and cones, teams worked together in designated areas to haul out and transfer debris to wheelbarrows which they pushed all the way to the huge dumpster staged next to the Harbor Office. Volunteers were able to return several octopi and tiny fish caught in the garbage back to their harbor home.

















Team members were in constant motion during the trash retrieval process, using buckets of sea water and brushes to clean the black sludge from the docks immediately and repeatedly . . .no small feat




All Volunteers were rewarded for their efforts with sandwiches and sodas for lunch, and the knowledge that they did their part in helping keep our home harbor clean.

# **Annual Harbor Flare Shoot Part of Boat Safety Week**

Tuesday, May 17 at around six, Rick from the Harbor Patrol held a flare shoot west of the Yacht Club on Ledbetter beach. Several of us from the Power Squadron showed up to join in. Rick had a lot of old expired aerial flares and handheld flares that we could set off. He also had an emergency life raft that had expired, so he was able to demonstrate how it works.





The Coast Guard requires that you have on board at least three handheld flares that are good for both day and night. The orange smoke flares are daytime flares whereas the red flares are good for both day and night. The 12 mm and the 25 mm gun flares get up higher over the waves so they may be seen better but they only last a few seconds. The parachute and aerial flares really shot up high and lingered for a much longer time increasing the chance of being seen. Firing off these flares really gave you a feeling as to what to expect. Since these flares were old, there were a few duds and a couple of aerials didn't eject from the tube you were holding. That made it a little exciting wondering what to do with this flare going off in your hand.

Just remember when setting off a handheld flare, hold it over the side of the boat so that the slag won't fall on the boat and start a fire, and when shooting off an aerial, make sure it is pointed straight up.



The Harbor Patrol puts this flare shoot on once a year at this time, so I would recommend attending next year when they do this again.

## **Annual Nautical Swap Meet**
