

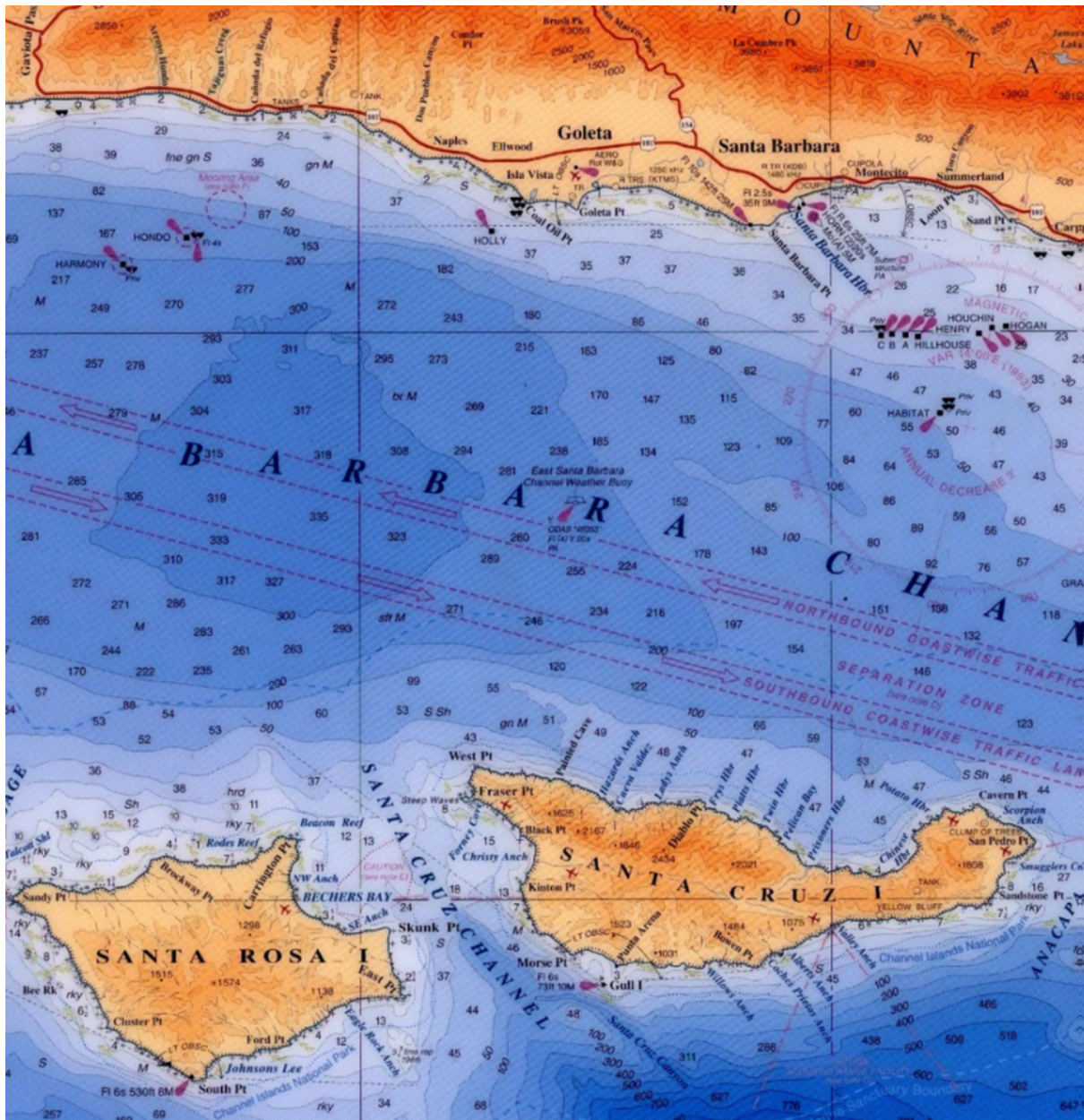

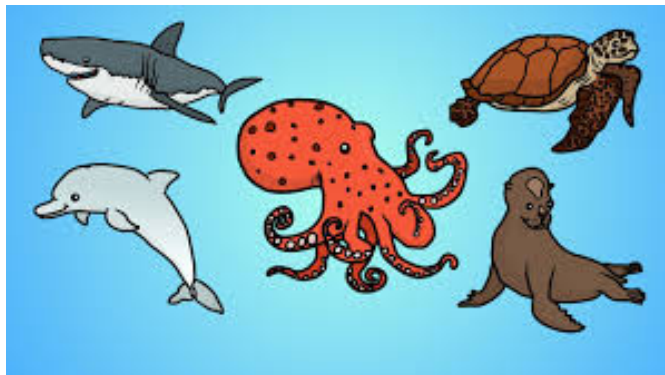


## Spring Conference 2026

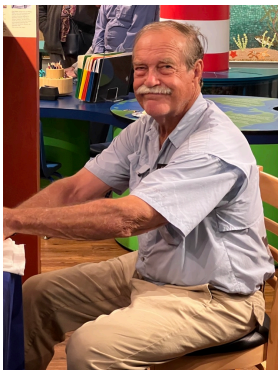

# **SSCA Launches Monthly Training Webinars for Cruisers**

Practical Risk Awareness • Real-World Systems Insight • Better Go / No-Go Decisions  
Norfolk, VA — January 2026 —

The Seven Seas Cruising Association (SSCA) has launched a new monthly Zoom Webinar training series supporting fundamentals and introducing members and guests to HAL (Hybrid Applied Layer) — SSCA's AI-assisted decision-support framework designed to help cruisers interpret conditions more clearly, recognize risk earlier, and make better operational decisions afloat.

The series runs on the last Thursday of each month at 7:00 PM Eastern, beginning January 29, 2026, and continues through June 2026. All sessions are delivered via Zoom Webinar in an observer-friendly format.

## **What Is HAL?**

HAL is not an app or autopilot. It is an AI “buddy” framework that runs inside guided ChatGPT sessions, helping cruisers fuse authoritative data, vessel knowledge, and real-world observations into clearer situational understanding.

HAL is designed to:

- support human judgment, not replace it
- surface risks earlier
- reduce common escalation traps
- improve interpretation of weather, systems, and location-specific information
- Access to HAL tools is provided to SSCA members, though non-members are welcome to attend the training webinars.

## **HAL Training Modules (Modules 1–5)**

Each monthly webinar focuses on a specific HAL training module drawn from SSCA's Seven Seas University (SSU) curriculum:

## **Module 1 — Weather Interpretation & Risk Awareness**

Understanding weather products, forecast limitations, pattern recognition, and common misreads that lead to poor go/no-go decisions.

## **Module 2 — Boat Equipment & Failure Pattern Recognition**

Using HAL to reason through real-world equipment issues, maintenance risk, and failure escalation — not diagnostics, but decision support.

## **Module 3 — Rigging & Structural Assessment (Visual Analysis)**

Photo-based and observation-based rigging checks, risk triage, and when to escalate to professional inspection.

## **Module 4 — Port Guides & Cruising Location Intelligence**

Applying HAL to SSCA Port Guides, regional knowledge, customs considerations, and on-arrival risk awareness.

## **Module 5 — Integrated Cruising Scenarios**

Combining weather, equipment, and location data into practical decision workflows cruisers face offshore and in port.

The “revenue opportunities” listed, such as charging for the currently free 90 minute parking spaces, charging for classroom usage (the fee is currently waived for organizations like ours), along with increasing slip fees (of course) are of interest. These options and more are to be discussed and evaluated this year from now until June 2026.

## Free OpenCPN Online Seminar

OpenCPN is free chart plotting software, popular with boaters worldwide, and used by America’s Boating Club | United States Power Squadrons for teaching courses. A free OpenCPN online seminar is now available at the [online education store](#). To access it, simply browse the list of online courses and select “Introduction to OpenCPN” (the second-to-last course). Add it to your cart, then proceed to checkout. If you already have an account, just log in and complete your purchase. If you don’t have an account, follow the prompts to create one. This seminar covers how to install OpenCPN, download and update charts, configure chart displays, create waypoints and routes, and integrate OpenCPN with GPS for live navigation. It’s a great resource for students taking Marine Navigation or anyone interested in learning OpenCPN. [–Barbara Herrmann](#)

The Santa Barbara Maritime Museum (SBMM) is pleased to announce the next presentation in its Maritime Distinguished Speaker Series on Thursday, February 19, 2026 at 7:00 p.m. The talk, "Shooting for the Stars: Sunflower Star Laboratory's Community-Based Approach to Pycnopodia Recovery," will be delivered by Reuven Bank, co-founder and chairman of the board of the Sunflower Star Laboratory (SSL).

*Pycnopodia helianthoides*, commonly known as the sunflower star, is a massive, vibrantly-coloured seastar predator that once roamed coastal kelp forests, devouring sea urchins and maintaining ecological balance. In the

2013–14 sea star wasting syndrome outbreak, one of the largest marine-disease events on record, these keystone predators collapsed into functional extinction along California's coast. With their loss came the dramatic decline of kelp forests—over 96 percent of Northern California's kelp canopy has



vanished in the last decade, and the trend extends into regions of Santa Barbara County.

“At SBMM, we believe a healthy ocean means a healthy people and region — our next chapter will deepen that link between local maritime history, ecosystem resilience, and public stewardship,” said Director of Education Lis Perry.

Founded in 2021 by a coalition of concerned community members, the Sunflower Star Laboratory is a nonprofit conservation-aquaculture initiative that is now rearing part of California’s first cohort of human-reared juvenile sunflower stars. The talk will highlight SSL’s pioneering research methods, their partnerships across North America, and how their efforts tie directly into kelp-forest restoration and ecosystem resilience in the Santa Barbara Channel region. SSL’s community-based model makes it an ideal lens for understanding how local engagement and science can intersect to rebuild ecosystem health.

“We’re honored to host leaders who bring both rigorous science and community heart — this presentation on sunflower star recovery shows how bold action and compassion go hand in hand for the Santa Barbara Channel’s future,” said Executive Director TBD.

### **About the Speaker:**

Reuven Bank is a former coastal resource manager in the U.S. Peace Corps (Philippines) and has served as chairman of the Sunflower Star Laboratory’s Board of Directors since its founding. “Kelp forests are an essential ecosystem for our planet, and they are disappearing before our eyes in California. Restoring the sunflower star is the single most impactful step we can take to give California’s beleaguered kelp forests a chance at recovery,” Bank says. “I’m excited to share how the Sunflower Star Laboratory team is super-charging recovery efforts for this vital keystone species and the ecosystems they support.”

This presentation aligns with SBMM’s mission to explore and interpret the rich and diverse maritime and marine-ecosystem history of the Santa Barbara Channel and beyond.
